As Presbyterians, we are called to embody Christ's love and extend a warm welcome to all people.

This conviction shapes our understanding of hospitality, creating an intentional space where every person is seen and valued in the fullness of their identities. **Sharing pronouns with pins or buttons can quickly and clearly provide that affirmation.**

Many LGBTQIA+ people have experienced previous discrimination and rejection by sharing their pronouns. By sharing our own pronouns, much like introducing ourselves with our own names, we welcome others to share their own. This small gesture communicates a powerful message: **we see you, accept you, and honor your identity as a child of God.**

For LGBTQIA+ people in particular, this kind of intentional welcome can be life-changing. Too often, they have experienced rejection or discrimination in faith communities that are supposed to be places of love and safety. By opening our doors to marginalized sexual and identities, churches can offer hope and healing. By visibly welcoming others to share their pronouns, our actions show our commitment to protecting all people's dignity and identities.
